• **University Course Pre-registration for fall 2009**

**Courses in Divisions Other than the Law School** - Students interested in enrolling in courses in other divisions of the University for the fall 2009 semester may pre-enroll using the University Enrollment process. Law students will use the University system to select their non-law courses. **The pre-registration period for law students to select non-law courses is scheduled for April 13-15, 2009.** To pre-enroll you must use the Student Center at: <http://studentcenter.cornell.edu>

If you do not know how to use the University Online Enrollment process, you should visit the University site that explains the process: <http://registrar.sas.cornell.edu/Student/courseenroll-FAQ.html>

**Please Note: Pre-enrollment does not guarantee enrollment in the course.** Students enrolling in non-law courses for JD credit will also need to complete the required petition with the Law School Registrar's office, at the Registrars website (<https://support.law.cornell.edu/students>), Course Registration link, *Request for Credit for Outside Course*. A student electing a course outside the Law School for credit or otherwise, must also register for at least 9 credit hours in the Law School each term. Regardless of the number of courses elected outside the Law School, a student must earn 72 semester credit hours in professional law subjects. This applies to all law students, including those in joint degree programs.

• **Law School Course Pre-registration for fall 2009 - To the Classes of 2010 & 2011** - On-Line Pre-Registration for fall 2009 Law School courses will take place in early summer. You will be notified by email to your Cornell NetID email account when the pre-registration site is available. - **Coat and Book Lockers** - Students should be sure to remove all items from book and coat lockers by **May 31, 2009**. • **As you study for exams:** Hornbooks, study aids, and casebooks are on reserve at the Circulation Desk. These and other library resources can be useful for your outlining and studying. Overnight checkout at 8:00 p.m. are available for reserve books.

• **Study Rooms:** Group study rooms in the Law Library are available to law students on the fourth floor and in the Casual Study Room (at the top of the stairs at the east end of the Reading Room). Study rooms and unreserved carrels are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

• **Food and Drinks.** Drinks are allowed in the library in containers that have covers, such as water bottles, coffee cups with lids, and soda cans. Food is not allowed in the library, in order to protect the materials and to prevent attracting rodents and bugs.

• **Cell phones.** Be sure to turn off the ringer on your cell phone while in the library, and please leave the library when you conduct a cell phone conversation.

• **Research Consultations** are available throughout the year but are especially helpful to prepare for summer employment. An appointment will focus on your unique research needs, and can range from covering resources in a specific jurisdiction or practice area to refreshing research skills. **Appointment forms are available at the Circulation Desk and online** for you to pick a date and time and Research Attorney preference, if any, at:

- **Visiting other libraries: The Law Library is a member of the Research Library Group (RLG)**, an international consortium of major research libraries. The SHARES Program of RLG allows students and faculty to gain access to the collections of those libraries in the program by showing their institutional ID card. You will not be able to check out materials, but will be able to have full use of the collection within the library you visit. **It is recommended that you make your initial contact during the day** at whatever law library you visit; full-time staff who are aware of the reciprocal arrangements are around then to make your entry easier.

Access to non-SHARES libraries cannot be guaranteed. For institutions not participating in the SHARES program, it is recommended that you bring a letter of introduction in addition to your Cornell ID. You may obtain a letter from **Chris O'Hara**, in room 360. We ask that you request such a letter at least 48-hours in advance.
